It would appear that the first ten and last six sheets were not set by the same compositor: from sig. M3 (p.165) l.7, the preposition 'than' is consistently spelled as 'then', the last 'than' occurring on sig. L7^v (p.158) l.8; from sig. M3, chapters are headed 'CAP.' instead of 'CHAP.'.

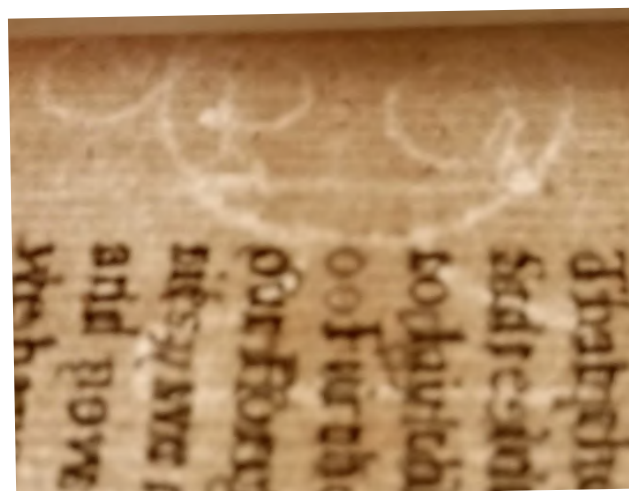
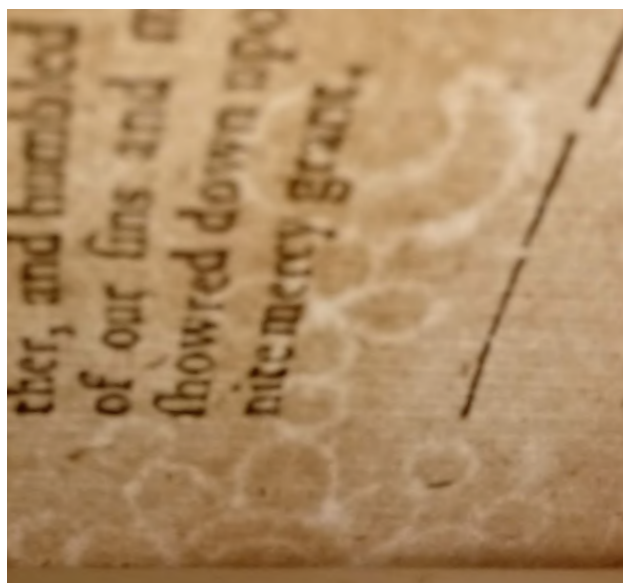

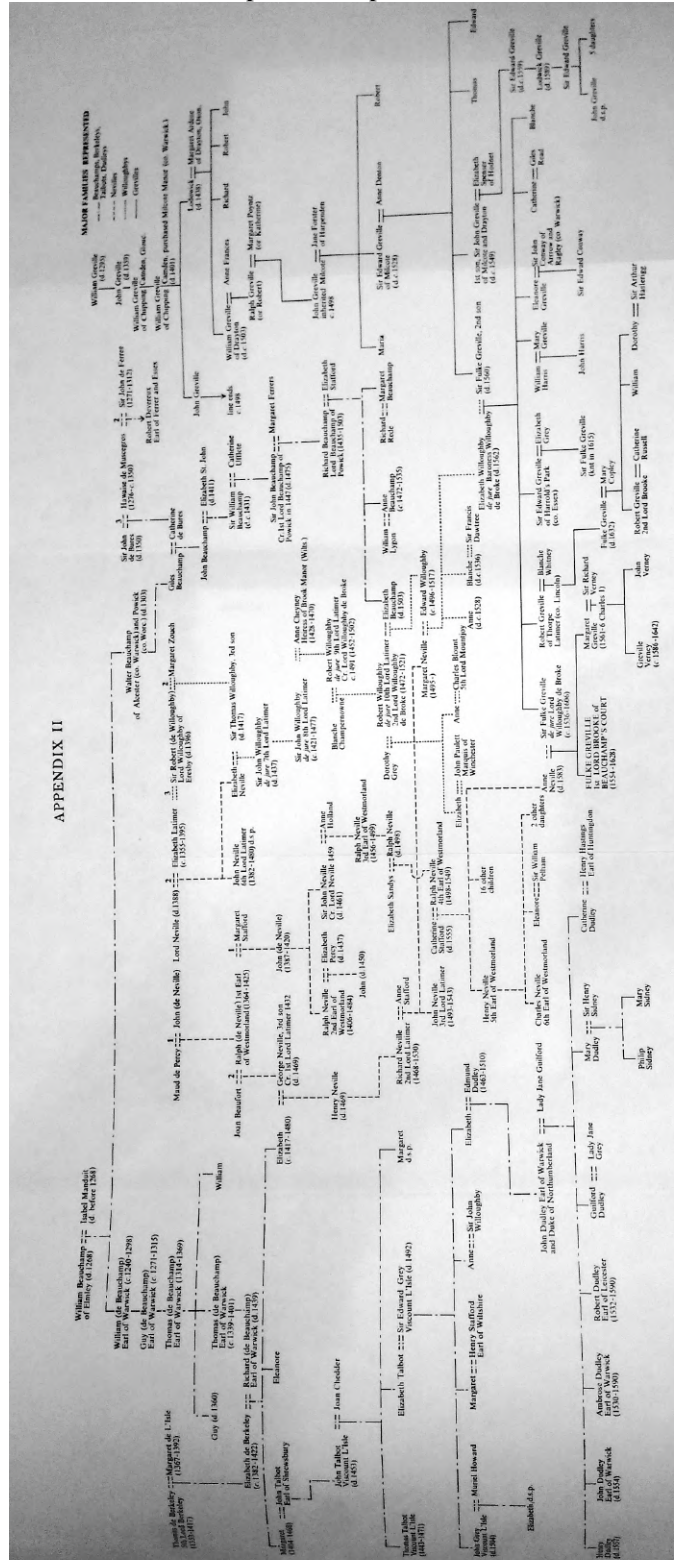

ANEXO E - Árvore Genealógica de Fulke Greville

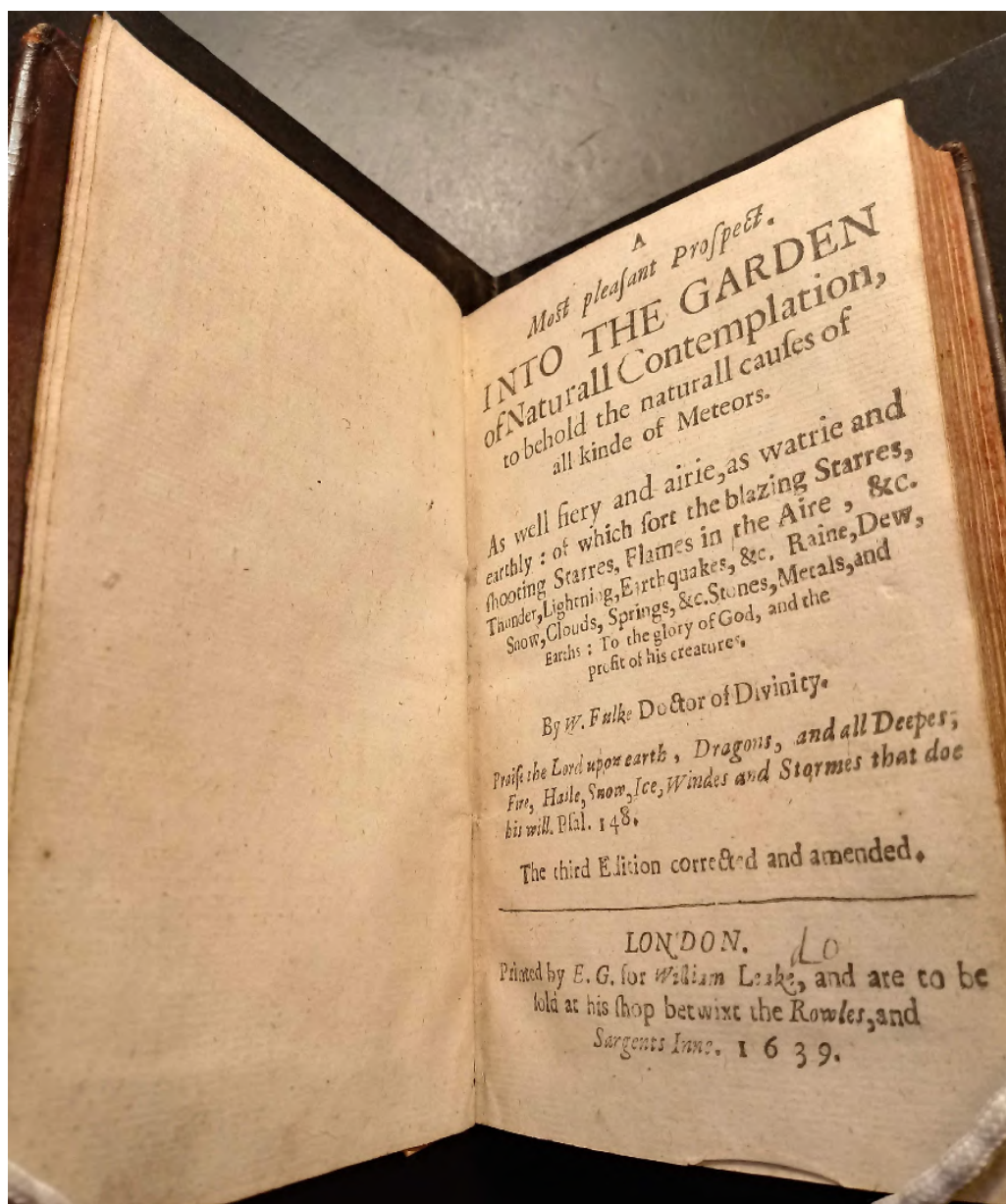
Árvore Genealógica de Fulke Greville produzida por Rebholz⁵³⁹
